On 5<sup>th</sup> March 2025, millions of Christians around the world began the lent period. This marks the beginning of a 40 day period of fasting, prayer and reflection in preparation for Easter.

On this day, he reminded us on the need to fast and pray during this period to imitate the fasting Jesus did while in the desert, a time to give up on something as a form self-discipline, seek forgiveness and renew our commitment to God. He gave the following analogy to ponder on:

"There is a story of a prince, who had a spiritual director, a priest, who loved him very much and guided him. One day the priest, already old, died. That night, the prince had a dream. His priest appeared to him and told him some mysterious words: "after five". The prince thought: "perhaps I am also going to die in five days, and the priest wants me to be prepared. So he prepared himself. But he didn't die. Then he thought: "perhaps he meant after five weeks"... and so he prepared himself more as he had more time, but he didn't die either. "Perhaps", he thought, "he meant five months", and so he prepared himself even more, he organized the things of the Kingdom, took care of the poor, but he didn't die. - During lent, Christians are encouraged to abstain from meat on ash Wednesday, Good Friday and each Friday to honor Jesus sacrificing his flesh on Good Friday.
